- What was your reaction when you learned that the pitcher was created out of the clay that represented our lives? What does this tell you about the body of Christ? The life of Christ within us?
- Think of and describe a time when you were extremely thirsty: what happened, how did it feel, and what did you do to finally quench it?
- Describe the scene when Jesus spoke up at the Festival. What do you think the reaction was of: The disciples? The crowd? The Pharisees?
- How did this statement represent the fulfillment of the Jewish festival?
- How can Jesus be the source of water that ultimately quenches your thirst? What is that thirst that He quenches?
- Do you agree that people have a spiritual thirst? Why or why not?
