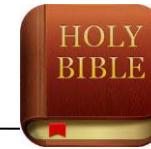

### Talking it over (use this for discussion around your community group):

- Have someone in your group read (or summarize) the main passage for today.
- What are some popular (perhaps inaccurate) ideas of what heaven is like? Where do you think those ideas have come from?
- How is that different than what is in this passage? Describe what heaven really looks like, according to this passage.
- What do you think is different about heaven then earth? What is the same?
- Was there ever a time that you were separated from someone you loved for a long period of time? What was it like when you were able to be back together again?
- How is that experience like heaven?
- If you are a Christian, how much time do you spend considering what heaven is like?
- Is the appeal of heaven more about its appearance, its culture/society, or about who is there? How appealing is it, and why, that we can be present with Jesus?

### Digging Deeper (if you still have time, or for further study later, go through these questions):

- Rank in order from most to least the reasons people become Christian:
  - To fix a messed up life
  - To resolve guilt
  - To be saved from Hell
  - To go to Heaven
- Is it wrong for a Christian to look forward to going to heaven? Why or why not? (read Philippians 1:21-24)
- If you were to die as soon as you walked out of this room, are you certain that you would be in heaven forever? Why or why not? If not, you can be. Talk to a pastor or someone else about how.
